The Atlas, sevas and Armenian etamine are traditional Armenian art work. The women of Aniar are persistent to keep their traditions alive making these authentic pieces that not only represent the Armenian culture but also symbolize women empowerment and the endangered species in the area.

Hima is a community based approach used for the conservation of sites, species and habitats, at the same time it helps communities have their products marketed. All the

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products marketed in the Souk el Hima are related to nature and the Lebanese heritage.







Hima Fekha | Handmade Carpets

Only in Al Fekha regions handmade carpets are still weaved from natural wool and dyed with natural colors extracted from plants, trees, leaves and fruits such as walnut, onion and pomegranate.



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Hima Qoleileh | products

This product is made by the women of Qoleileh who make use of natural, recyclable and eco-friendly materials like sea shells, bottle caps and paper to make accessories, fabrics and home decorative items.

These handmade products are made of natural eco-friendly materials popular in Bekaa.
